Goals:

- Strengthen data collection sharing and processes with state-level partners
- Collaborate with state and local partners to develop county-level substance use data profiles
- Establish SEOW web presence
 - Increase availability of substance use data
 - Create website/platform for disseminating information electronically
- Increase strength of self-reported substance use data
 - Implement the adolescent Communities that Care Survey in all 46 counties consistently
 - Implement the CORE Survey in all colleges and universities in South Carolina
- Provide training and technical assistance to utilize data reports and informatics
