# **Communities that Care Survey Factsheet**

# Prescription Drug and Illicit Drug Use, Access and Perception

This factsheet provides an overview of **drug-related** information as reported by the participants of the 2022 Communities-That-Care survey. Over **15,000** students were surveyed over the course of the 2021-2022 school year.

### **Risk Behaviors**

In the past year, 2.8% of students have sold illegal drugs.

In the past year, 1.5% of students have attacked someone due to drugs.

### **Access to Substance**

- **26.2%** of students stated that it is **easy** to obtain prescription drugs.
- **22.9%** of students stated that it is **easy** to obtain prescription pain pills.
- **13.2%** of students stated that it is **easy** to obtain illicit drugs like cocaine, LSD, or amphetamines.
- **10.3%** of students stated that it is **easy** to obtain heroin or fentanyl.
- 29.9% of students reported that they obtained prescription drugs from a family member voluntarily and 11.9% obtained it from a family member without their consent.
- 22.1% of students reported that they obtained prescription pain relievers from a family member voluntarily and 11.3% obtained it from a family member without their consent.

### **Percent of Students Lifetime and Current Use**

- 7.7% of students have used a prescription drug without a doctor's prescription in their lifetime and 2.8% have used in the past 30 days.
- **3.4%** of students have used prescription pain pills (OxyContin, Vicodin, etc.) without a doctor's prescription in their **lifetime** and **1.6%** have used in the **past 30 days**.
- 1.1% of students have used heroin or fentanyl in their lifetime and 0.6% have used heroin or fentanyl in the past 30 days.
- 1.5% of students have used cocaine in their lifetime.

## **Perception of Risk**

**84.4%** of students believe that a person has **moderate or great risk** of harming themselves physically or in other ways if they use prescription drugs that are not prescribed to them.

**84.8%** of students believe that a person has **moderate or great risk** of harming themselves physically or in other ways if they use prescription pain pills that are not prescribed to them.
